Ohio Valley Goodwill is celebrating its 100th Anniversary and its mission of putting people to work during 2016! The organization is excited to share its story of employment successes for the tens of thousands of men and women with disabilities and our nation's veterans that the organization has served over the past century. Since 1916, Ohio Valley Goodwill Industries has served individuals with disabilities throughout the Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky region. Founded by Methodist minister Reverend Richard Scully, Ohio Valley Goodwill Industries initially served a variety of populations including those in poverty, individuals seeking vocational training, people with disabilities and families in need. The organization's facilities originally occupied three locations in downtown Cincinnati. In the mid-1950's, with the help of organizational leaders and civic volunteers, Ohio Valley Goodwill moved to a centralized location in Woodlawn, Ohio. This facility opened for service in July, 1957, and is still used today. Ohio Valley Goodwill's entire Woodlawn corporate center was renovated in 2004 to meet the expanding service needs of the Greater Cincinnati community.

In the past ten years, Ohio Valley Goodwill has expanded its presence to offer four satellite vocational training centers throughout the four county region it serves (Hamilton, Butler, Clermont and Warren); opened six new retail stores and eleven Attended Donation Centers, and is positioning itself to do even more in the coming year. In addition, Goodwill has been recognized for its contributions to environmental stewardship and for recycling more than 45 million pounds of donated materials each year, diverting them from area landfills.

As we celebrate our 100 years of success and move into a new century of service, Goodwill's prominence in the community and reputation as an outstanding provider of vocational services will continue to grow. Today, the diverse needs which drive community members to seek our assistance are constantly changing, and Ohio Valley Goodwill will continue to change in response. Even as we move forward to meet the needs of those we serve, Goodwill's mission remains the same: to provide quality skills training and employment services for people with disabilities and our nation's veterans. Goodwill's commitment to putting people to work is just as strong and relevant in today's challenging world as it was back in the beginning. 

For the third year in a row, Ohio Valley Goodwill will be hosting an Earth Day

Electronic Recycling Celebration on Sunday, April 24th from 11:00 am until 5:00 pm. The donation event will be held at all Goodwill locations in the Tri-State. Donations of computers, laptops, keyboards, monitors and other electronic equipment will be gratefully accepted at all 31 Goodwill Donation locations!

Working in partnership with Cohen Electronics Recycling; an E-steward and R2 certified recycling vendor; Goodwill is hoping to collect over 80,000 lbs. of donations in this year's drive. During the 2015 Earth Day Donation event, Goodwill collected more than 60,000 lbs. at just its headquarters location in the village of Woodlawn.

"It's important for our generous donors to know that Ohio Valley Goodwill accepts donations of computers and other electronic equipment every day at all 31 of our Donation Centers," said Jeff Eastham, Director of Operations. "The Earth Day event is held just to raise awareness about Goodwill's commitment to recycling of all types but, specifically in this case, computers and related electronic equipment."

Last year, Ohio Valley Goodwill recycled more than 43,000,000 lbs. of donated materials, diverting them from area landfills. The organization received the 2014 Hamilton County Recycling award for "Excellence in Re-Use" as well. "We want our donors to know that when you choose to donate to Goodwill, you are choosing to recycle responsibly," explained Eastham.
