OHIO VALLEY GOODWILL'S EMPLOYMENT SERVICES TEAM CELEBRATES COMMUNITY RECOGNITION!



For Ohio Valley Goodwill's Employment Services and Job Coaching team, it was a year of well-deserved recognition. Initially, the Employment Services team was recognized by Ohio Business Magazine with the 2021 Ohio Success Award in the category of "Best Nonprofit Response" in regards to its handling of COVID-19 and the impact on the individuals the organization serves. The Ohio Success Awards honors the most successful and consistent organizations and leaders across the state.

In June, Ohio Valley Goodwill and its Employment Services team would also be honored with the

2021 Community Inclusion Award from Butler County DD, in recognition of their extraordinary response to helping individuals adversely impacted by the pandemic.

In March 2020, when mandatory business closures took effect, more than 150 people whom the organization's Employment

team had successfully placed in community employment were either laid off or jobs were eliminated. The abrupt sudden loss of these jobs was devastating to the placed individuals as well as to Goodwill's team of Job Coaches; who provide the supports needed once individuals are placed into employment. Without warning, these team members very quickly had to provide a "virtual" system of supports to keep individuals engaged and to work with employers to either re-instate the individuals once the mandates were relaxed or to create new positions. For the next three months, Goodwill's Job Coaches worked diligently to help more than 125 to return to their work situations and/or obtain new employment. All 150 individuals continue to receive support services through Goodwill.

20TH ANNIVERSARY GOODWILL GOLF OUTING A SUCCESS!

PIGABILITIES ATHLETES FLY HIGH VIRTUALLY IN 2021!

For the second year in a row, Ohio Valley Goodwill's team of dedicated athletes trained for and participated in a Virtual PigAbilities event on June 22nd. More than sixteen athletes and coaches from the organization's Center for Advocacy, Recreation and Education (CARE) and Pre-Vocational Training programs joined together to fly around the track at Glenwood Gardens and successfully cross the finish line with much fanfare from their coaches. Pig Works, the hosting organization for the annual Cincinnati Flying Pig Marathon, had determined that despite the situation becoming safer for athletes to engage in a larger in-person event, it was not quite safe enough yet. Next year will mark the return to the in-person PigAbilities event.

The triumphant athletes finished up the one mile course and then, returned to Ohio Valley Goodwill's corporate headquarters for the official medal ceremony in partnership with the Pig Works team; including the Pig mascot.

Ohio Valley Goodwill is proud to be the Title Sponsor of the PigAbilities event which is an empowering option for athletes of all ages and abilities who want to commit to going the distance by making healthy choices in their lives. During a typical year (pre-COVID), the PigAbilities event would take place when there are fewer crowds, increased accessibility and more parking. This year, like last year, Pig Works offered Virtual options for the Spring and Summer with a hoped-for in-person event taking place the week of October 29th-31st in downtown Cincinnati.

GOODWILL LAUNCHES SUMMER YOUTH SERVICES

Ohio Valley Goodwill's very popular Summer Youth service began its 2021 season on Monday, June 7th. Currently, one of the largest such programs in the Greater Cincinnati area, this year's Summer Youth served dozens of transition youth over two four week sessions. The program is designed to provide students with a variety of team building and vocational exploration experiences structured to help them gather information about the world of work.

As part of the Summer Youth Service, each student has the opportunity to learn work appropriate skills in a paid work experience in the community on typical job sites. After their community work experience, each student along with Goodwill staff report to the referring counselor through Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities, regarding the experience and job preferences. In this follow-up meeting Goodwill provides recommendations to assist individuals in moving forward with their vocational goals.
