Ohio Valley Goodwill Introduces New GoodGuides™ Program

Ohio Valley Goodwill Industries is proud to announce a new program designed to assist youth in overcoming disadvantages and avoiding delinquency. The effort is part of a national mentoring program known as the Goodwill GoodGuides $^{\text{TM}}$ program.

The Goodwill GoodGuides[™] program is a new federally funded youth mentoring program which is supported by a \$19.1 million grant to Goodwill Industries International (GII), through the US Department of Justice, Office of

Juvenile Justice and Delinguency Prevention. This new program is made possible through funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act with the money being divided among 56 community Goodwill agencies. Ohio Valley Goodwill is one of the partner agencies participating in the program and will be supported through a two-year, \$299,723 grant. The goal of the program is to match at-risk youth with caring adults and provide them with guidance and support through career exploration and job readiness skills.

Youth will be paired with trusted, caring volunteer mentors in the community. The mentors will provide support and guidance that will lead youth to opportunities and resources that they need to prepare for post-secondary

education and/or employment. Ohio Valley Goodwill's program officially launched the first week of March and will be based in Covington, Kentucky.

By engaging youth in positive activities with adults who are strong role models, youth receive the encouragement and support they need to maximize their potential. GoodGuides engages adult volunteers who are expected to commit to supporting, guiding, and being a friend to a young person for a period of at least one year. Mentors help youth

develop and reach positive academic, career, and personal goals. The program targets youths between the ages of 12 and 17 who are at-risk for dropping out of school, facing legal troubles, or are at risk due to issues such as abuse, disability, drug or alcohol dependence, or gang membership.

"With Goodwill GoodGuides™, we will be able to offer expanded mentoring services to the youth of our community. Goodwill will recruit, train and support volunteer mentors to engage youth in promoting their career development and life skills," said Tim Spoleti, Program Manager for GoodGuides™ of Ohio Valley Goodwill.

The prestigious award is presented to an individual whose lifetime achievement represents a major contribution to the rehabilitation of people with disabilities. Charlie

Wright, Goodwill's Board Chairman, nominated and presented Joe with the award during the 2009 SWORA Awards Luncheon event held on Friday, December 4th at the Crowne Plaza Hotel.
