For the third year in a row, Ohio Valley Goodwill participated in the annual Thanksgiving Day Race in downtown Cincinnati. More than 40 enthusiastic Goodwill volunteers greeted race participants with spirit signs, noise-makers, cheers, and more as they passed each donation station.

Ohio Valley Goodwill became involved in the Thanksgiving Day race through the efforts of long-time runner and former Olympian, Julie Isphording, who originally sought the help of the organization. Through her efforts and involvement, Goodwill has been able to have a presence at the race and has become a sponsor the past three years. Additionally, Isphording has assisted with several large-scale donations for the organization including one this past year of almost 400 Eddie Bauer coats three weeks before the race. "Goodwill is thrilled to be a part of this great Cincinnati tradition on Thanksgiving morning," said Sharon Hannon, Goodwill's Marketing Specialist and race day coordinator. "We are delighted to join in celebrating Cincinnati, and of course, our spirit of giving each year," added Hannon.

Donations from this past Thanksgiving Day Race totaled 3,440 pounds and are used to support Ohio Valley Goodwill's mission of service in the community. Simply pack your old computer equipment into the car with other household donations and drop it off at a convenient Goodwill donation center where it will be responsibly recycled. Goodwill accepts any brand of unwanted computer or other computer equipment. Donors may request receipts at the time of their donations to receive tax deductions.

With the help of programs like Dell Reconnect and Goodwill, Dell recycled more than 150 million pounds of unwanted computer equipment in 2012 and plans to significantly exceed that amount over the next three years. The Dell Reconnect program is a win-win for all involved. It benefits the environment, the community and Goodwill's mission of putting people to work. Proceeds from the Dell Reconnect program go directly into Goodwill's skill training and employment programs for men and women with disabilities and our nation's veterans. "Goodwill couldn't be more pleased about the partnership with the Dell Reconnect program," said Bill Martin, Goodwill's Industrial Services Production Manager. "It has allowed Goodwill to become a major player in its on-going efforts to preserve the planet through its reuse and repurposing initiatives," added Martin.
