The Service Guild of Ohio Valley Goodwill Industries is celebrating a very special anniversary this year. Celebrating its 80th Anniversary, the Service Guild kicked off the festivities with their annual Spring Mini Fest on May 3rd and 4th in the Tri-County retail store. The history of the Goodwill Service Guild goes back many years. Established in 1933, the Service Guild was organized by key women from these early churches and formed the nucleus of the group which now has over 100 members. Its first leader was Mrs. Edna Woodward who provided leadership for the organization for many years.

The Service Guild and its volunteers support the Treasure Island Gift Shop which operates in the Tri-County retail store and provides much of the income that the organization generates.

#### Ohio Valley Goodwill's Food Service Training Program Receives The "Clean Kitchen Award"

Ohio Valley Goodwill's Food Service Training program was delighted to receive the "Clean Kitchen Award" this spring from the Hamilton County Public Health Department for outstanding sanitation practices in its kitchen preparation area. Housed at its corporate headquarters, the busy food services kitchen serves between 150 to 200 meals per day to its program participants, staff and other visitors, and also serves as the training site for Goodwill's Food Service Training program.

"I'm very proud of our staff and trainees that do the hard work necessary to meet the requirements outlined by Hamilton County Public Health," said Alison McElfresh, Chef and Supervisor.

Goodwill's Food Service Training program offers the opportunity for trainees to learn all of the skills related to working in a restaurant setting or other food service oriented occupation. Participants in the Goodwill program are typically sponsored by the Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation. The goal is to help individuals learn the skills needed for employment and then to get jobs in the community. "We are pleased to partner with Hamilton County Public Health to provide Food Handler Training and certification for our trainees," said McElfresh. Hamilton County Public Health certificates enhance their marketability in terms of future job placement.

#### Goodwill Participates in New "PigAbilities" Event as Part of Flying Pig Marathon

This year, more than 150 athletes took part in the new event. Athletes representing many of the organizations who are part of the Community Ambassadors Resource Alliance (CARA), a non-profit dedicated to enriching the lives of people with disabilities, took part in this event. Ohio Valley Goodwill is a founding member of the CARA group and was thrilled to take part in the new PigAbilities event which was the culmination of a 12-week training program for the athletes involved.

PigAbilities team members set individual goals for their training efforts, learned about nutrition and making healthy choices, and celebrated milestones along the way. The day of the marathon served as the occasion for all of the athletes to finish the 26th mile of the famous race and receive a medal for their efforts. Ohio Valley Goodwill team members this year included program participants Kristine Agoston, Craig Franta, Melinda Gableman, and Goodwill staff members, Sharon Hannon, Darlene O'Hair and the Agoston family. Also joining the team were athletes from Catholic Residential Services, Hamilton County Developmental Disabilities Services, Stepping Stones Center, RHC, United Cerebral Palsy and Visionaries and Voices. The Goodwill team members loved having their dedication to good health recognized and dozens of on-lookers cheered on the racers throughout the event and applauded the athletes when medals were awarded.

#### Ohio Valley Goodwill Receives Grant from the U.S. Department of Labor Homeless Veterans' Reintegration Program

Ohio Valley Goodwill Industries is pleased to announce that it has received word from U.S. Sen. Sherrod Brown (D-OH) in early July that

the organization has been awarded a new federal grant from U.S. Department of Labor's (DOL) Homeless Veterans' Reintegration Program (HVRP). The \$600,000 grant will be used to provide job training and support for homeless veterans.

"The men and women of the Armed Forces have been made a promise that if they defend our country, a grateful nation will provide them with services and benefits they have earned," Brown, a member of the Senate Committee on Veterans' Affairs, said. "These federal funds are a down payment in the promise to support those who have already given so much to our nation."

Ohio Valley Goodwill Industries Rehabilitation Center will utilize the funds for a variety of support services, including education and job training, counseling, job placement, and follow up assistance for homeless veterans in Cincinnati.

In the Greater Cincinnati area, Ohio Valley Goodwill has helped thousands of veterans build their civilian careers. Locally, in 2012, Ohio Valley Goodwill served more than 700 veterans. Since the early 1990's, the organization has helped more than 5000 veterans to receive assistance with transitional and permanent housing, skill training, and job placement assistance as well as case management support. "We are very proud of the quality services that we have been providing for the past twenty years for the hundreds of men and women that we have served at Ohio Valley Goodwill Industries," said Charlie Blythe, Goodwill's Grants Director. "This new grant will enable us to provide even greater services to more people."

"We are so pleased that Ohio Valley Goodwill has been awarded this new grant from the U.S. Department of Labor for our veterans program which will enable us to provide service excellence to our nation's veterans and continue the outstanding provision of vocational training that this program has become known for in the Greater Cincinnati community," said Joseph Byrum, President and CEO of Ohio Valley Goodwill Industries.
